

Joshua Rauh - Funding and Outside Activities (as of 8/2011)

I am an Associate Professor at the [Kellogg School of Management](#) at [Northwestern University](#), where I have been employed since July 2009. Through the [dean's office](#) at Kellogg and the [Zell Center for Risk Research at Kellogg](#), I receive a research budget which I spend on the research topics of my choosing.

In addition to my role as a faculty member at Kellogg, I have a few outside activities and affiliations. In the past three years I have:

(i) been a research associate and faculty research fellow of the [National Bureau of Economic Research](#) (NBER), a non-profit organization devoted to economic research.

(ii) been a research fellow of [Netspar](#) (Netherlands), a network aimed at connecting pension practice and pension science.

(iii) on two instances received research funding from outside of Kellogg: (1) from the Rotman International Centre for Pension Management at the University of Toronto (2008) and (2) from the Initiative on Global Markets at the University of Chicago (2008), when I was an Associate Professor at the University of Chicago. These grants have both expired.

(iv) periodically received standard speaking fees, consulting fees, or honoraria. During the last three years, I have received these types of fees from each of the following organizations: the Brookings Institution, the Global Association of Risk Professionals (GARP), Blue Cross Blue Shield of South Carolina, the Gerson Lehrman Group, Netspar, NBER, the New America Foundation, the Milken Institute, and Stanford University.
